



# Fiancé Visa Process

## Preparation

- Confirm your eligibility to adjust status
- Collect personal data including immigration and address history
- Collect required documents and relationship evidence
- Draft application packet

## File Fiance Petition

- Review application with attorney
- Submit application to government
- Receive confirmation of successful filing

## Monitor Pending Case

- Check case status periodically on [uscis.gov](https://uscis.gov)
- Respond to any government requests for additional information

## Prepare for Embassy Interview

- Obtain required background checks and legal documents
- Government assigns you an interview date at a U.S. Embassy in your home country
- Interview covers your legal eligibility and whether your relationship is real

## Travel to U.S. and Marriage

- Receive your fiance visa and travel to the U.S. before your visa expires (usually 180 days)
- Get legally married to your fiance within 90 days of your arrival in the U.S.

## Green Card Application

- Prepare and file your green card application, also known as "adjustment of status."

## Temporary Work Authorization

- About 90 days after you file the green card application, you'll receive work authorization and permission to travel internationally while your case is pending.

## Marriage Interview

- You and your spouse attend an in-person interview at the USCIS Office closest to your home in the U.S.
